Introduction



What is the NRPF Connect data report 2022/23?

This data report collates and analyses the data recorded by councils in England and Scotland using NRPF Connect in the 2022/23 financial year. It provides a snapshot of referrals made and the support provided by social care services around the UK for people with no recourse to public funds (NRPF). The data is used to inform policy recommendations.

What is NRPF Connect?

NRPF Connect is the national database and case management tool for councils to record details of households with NRPF that are being provided with accommodation and/or financial support by social services, hosted by the NRPF Network.

What support is recorded on NRPF Connect?

Councils can provide accommodation and financial support to people who are excluded from claiming benefits and mainstream housing assistance when statutory duties are engaged under social care legislation. Local authorities across the UK record the social care services they provide to families, adults with care needs, and care leavers with no recourse to public funds (NRPF). 
Notes on the data

- "Adults" refers to adults with care needs provided with support under S18(1) Care Act 2014, S19(1) Care Act 2014, S12 Social Work (Scotland) Act 1968, P7 Housing Act 1996, S1 Localism Act 2011, or S117 Mental Health Act 1983.
- "Families" refers to families with a child in need with support under S17 Children Act 1989 or S22 Children (Scotland) Act 1995.
- "Children and care leavers" refers to looked after children and young people leaving care supported under Children (Leaving Care) Act 2000, S20 Children Act 1989, S25 Children (Scotland) Act 1995, or S29 & S30 Children (Scotland) Act 1995.
- "Support costs" relate to accommodation and financial support (subsistence) costs only, and do not include staffing or other costs incurred by councils delivering support to NRPF households.
- Data was last downloaded from NRPF Connect on 05/12/2023





Grants of leave to remain still the most common reason for case closure

64% of adults and 77% of families who exited support did so following a grant of leave to remain.

This demonstrates that the majority of people and children supported by councils have a long-term future in the UK.

EU-exit still impacting social care services

EU nationals and people with EU-related leave, including pre-settled status, continue to make up a significant portion of NRPF households supported by councils: 24% of adults with care needs and 19% of families.

Councils received just under 1,000 new

referrals for this group in 2022/23.

Increasing costs to councils

The cost of providing accommodation and financial support to NRPF households continued to rise as councils reported a combined £77.6m in spend - a 22% increase from the end of 2021/22, far above inflation.

The rise appears to be driven by increasing per-case costs, particularly for adults with care and support needs.

Councils not fully recording support for adults with care and support needs

Adult social care reported a 61% rise in the cost of providing accommodation and financial support to adults with NRPF from the end of 2021/22, to £24.4m. However, with only 53 out of 82 councils recording financial data for adults, it is highly likely that this group remains significantly underreported.

Number of households on longterm support remains high despite immigration resolutions

Following <u>our 2021/22</u> recommendations, in January 2023 the Home Office NRPF team began a review

of the immigration cases of households that had been supported for 1000 days or more.

Despite the success of this review in resolving many long-standing claims, as more cases crossed the 1,000-day threshold the overall number of long-standing cases remained the same.

Recommendations



How can this data help achieve change?

The data helps us to understand the pressures facing local authorities and the nature of the support being provided to people with NRPF. Combined with our regular engagement with councils through regional networks, advice service and training delivery, we can use the data to make informed, evidence-based policy recommendations to central government. The data also informs our recommendations to councils to help them to improve and implement cost-efficient service delivery.

What changes are needed?

- To end homelessness, eradicate child poverty, and reduce pressures on councils, significant changes to immigration policy will be required, including ending the use of the NRPF condition.
- Whilst immigration-related restrictions on access to services remain in place, the data demonstrates that local
 authority support is frequently provided on a long-term basis and at high cost. A more ambitious approach from
 government will be needed to reduce costs for councils and ensure only short-term interventions are required, as set
 out in our detailed recommendations for government. Read our <u>recommendations for central government</u>.
- Councils also need to reflect on the findings of the data report to ensure their own practice is being properly
 evidenced and residents in need of support are being assisted to establish a route out of destitution. Read our










